

The Pastor Letter


Mission and Vision

Go and Make Disciples of All Nations, Baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and the Holy Spirit and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.

Matthew 28:19-20

This so-called Great Commission appears in many church mission statements either in whole or in part. We as Christians love to quote this text, reference it and cite it as the Biblical Foundation of our mission. But how many of us can say that we are actively participating in this mission?

Our first defense is usually to point to the church. Look at the mission of our church, the school, the Early Learning Center, the youth work, the scholarships, the missionaries we support, etc. As if to say that the evangelism efforts of our church a



Two questions. First, who discipled you? While the church may have played a significant role, when you start thinking of individuals there is probably a parent or a Sunday school teacher or someone who comes to mind. There was a disciple of Jesus who either knowingly or unknowingly discipled you.

The second question: who are you discipling? Here is where we may get a little sheepish. For many our discipling is done through the offering plate (at best). We have been misled by the "business" of the church to think that it is satisfactory for us to pay someone else to do the Great Commission on our behalf. We have bought into the Satanic lie that we are ill-equipped and unable to tell people about Jesus and that it is better to have a staff member, a teacher or a pastor, or someone else, anyone else do it besides us.

There is amazing personal value in sharing faith and telling people about Jesus. If we take seriously our faith in God and the end-results of that faith, eternal life in paradise and a present life filled with hope, how can we not be passionate, maybe even fanatical about sharing this good-news.

As March ends with the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus and my chapter of pastoral ministry at St. John also comes to a close, I hope that the next chapter begins, long before the next pastor arrives with our congregation taking ownership of their faith and personally becoming active in it.



Lent is a season when we are guided to the cross. Throughout this holy time, we are drawn to Calvary to live in forgiveness, hope, love, peace, trust and perseverance. Each week, the services in this series reveal how Christ and his cross serve as examples for us of how to live our lives for and through our crucified Lord and Savior.

Week 2 • Guided to Love (1 Timothy 1:13-14): When we are separated from others and from God by our sin, the cross brings us together through its love.

Week 3 • Guided to Peace (Colossians 1:19-20): With wars waging within and without, the cross settles them all with peace to body, mind and soul.

Week 4 • Guided to Trust (1 Timothy 1:15): Plagued by doubt and competing voices, we turn to the cross to put our trust fully in the salvation won for us there.

Week 5 • Guided to Perseverance (Ephesians 6:18): When we are faced with hardship, we look to Christ on the cross who endured to the end so that we might carry on.

Call to Order/Opening Devotion and Prayer: Reid called the meeting to order at 8:07 pm with a devotion and prayer.

Approval of Minutes: The January 15, 2024 meeting minutes were reviewed. Mike Anderson motioned to approve the January minutes. Christy Schmidt seconded. Motion carried.

Board Reports

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> by Katie Schnitzler. As per usual, giving and other budgeted income continues to increase from this same time last year and the expenses we can control are kept at the bare minimum. There was a generous gift of stock received the first part of February, so there is a cushion of \$133,223.10 currently sitting in the general fund. Praise God! There is, however, about \$110,000 worth of operating costs to be paid in the coming week. The current operating debt balance is \$267,000. Mike Anderson motioned to accept the Treasurer's report. Second by Karen Grant. Motion carried.

Trustees' Report by Todd Roberts. The trustees re-visited Pastor Fouts' family request about staying in the parsonage until the end of the school year. It was decided that there would be no utility cost for the family during their stay. Scott Miller visited to discuss installing gutter guards at the school/ELC to alleviate clogging issues. Scott also discussed options for installing a ladder system for easier access to the roof at school/ELC. Scott will get quotes to the trustees and a decision will be made from there. Trevor Hintz and Trent Scheer with T&T Lawn Care visited to answer questions about potentially taking over the mowing duties on the St. John Ministries' campus this year. The trustees are looking into all options before making a final decision. Trustees set the spring clean-up date for Saturday, April 20 at 9:00 am with a rain date of May 4. The trustees are providing the treats after worship for the month of February and will be partnering with the Stewardship board serving the Lenten meal on February 28.

Elders' Report by Mike Anderson. No transfers in or out. The elders will be serving soup this Wednesday (February 14). A Thrivent Action Team was used to purchase some of the supplies for the meal. They will start serving at 5:30 pm. There will be a variety of soups, some gluten free, and crackers provided. An anonymous donor will match up to \$10,000 for debt reduction for all donations at the meal and then through the end of February. St. John will have four confirmands this year. Confirmation has been scheduled for March 3 so the class may be confirmed by Pastor Fouts.

<u>Evangelism Report</u> by Tia Eriksen. Evangelism hopes to take the LIGHT group to pack boxes for Orphan Grain Train one day this summer. They will be serving the lent meal with parish ed. This past Sunday they set up supplies in the parish hall for making Valentine's Day cards. There were enough cards created for each shut-in, with multiple cards for many of them. The evangelism collection for April will be for Stephen Ministries. There are a few people interested in being trained Stephen Ministers, so the funds raised in April will help subsidize the cost of training for these people.

<u>Parish Education Report</u> by Christy Schmidt. There is no report at this time as they aren't meeting until next week.

<u>Parochial Education Report</u> by Brett Freudenberg. The boys and girls basketball teams are almost done with their seasons. The gym floor investigator visited last week. He made further inspections and took more measurements of numerous things. He will follow-up with an official report in the next two weeks. The Parochial Ed board is brainstorming a few more names to submit for nominations. The board approved the proposed pre-k and K-8 tuition rates and will be seeking approval from the Council. The board reviewed and approved the 2024-2025 school year calendar. Upcoming school events include the auction fundraiser, IGNITE, on March 2, the school musical on March 10, and Kindergarten round-up to take place on March 12.

<u>Early Learning Center (ELC) Report</u> by Ann Grant (email read by Reid). At their last meeting Katie visited to discuss budget updates. The board is working on finalizing proposed budget items. There will be a servant event on February 15 from 5:30 - 7:30 pm for the Briggs & Barrett project.

<u>Stewardship Report</u> by Karen Grant. Stewardship will meet next Monday (02/19). Karen noted that the last meal the Stewardship Board took leftover plates of food to some of the local shut-ins. These shut-ins were very appreciative of that gesture and Karen asked that all boards please remember those folks in the future.

<u>Old Business</u> Reid gave a reminder that all should continue to share their names for nominations to him or Katie.

New Business

- 1. 2024-2025 Budget In an effort to be more conscientious about the budgeting process, the Council will be approving proposed budget items for the 2024-2025 fiscal year PRIOR to those numbers being advertised publicly. The council was presented with a proposed income number for church contributions (\$1,099,277), school tuition (\$426,085), and the payroll expense number recommended by the Wellness Committee (\$2,309,621). Mike Anderson made a motion to accept all three of these numbers as presented. Brett Freudenburg seconded. Motion carried. These numbers are to be included in the budget to be approved by the voters in June.
- 2. Endowment Distribution The council reviewed the requests for the 2024 endowment distribution as proposed by the Endowment Committee. The total distribution amount is \$18,057.42 and will be used as follows: \$1,000 for high school senior scholarships, \$1,000 for LHNE student scholarships, \$5,000 for parsonage updates, \$3,000 for St. John school scholarships, \$6,711.84 for St. John school textbooks, \$1,000 for ELC tuition assistance, and \$345.58 was reinvested back in the ELC endowment fund. Todd Roberts made a motion to approve the 2024 endowment distribution as recommended. Mike Anderson seconded. Motion carried.

Next Meetings

Voters Meeting Monday, February 26, 2024 at 7:00 pm. Council Meeting Monday, March 18, 2024 at 8:00 pm.

Adjourn: Christy Schmidt motioned to adjourn. Brett Freudenburg seconded. Motion carried.

The meeting was closed with the prayer by Pastor Fouts at 8:42pm.





CHALLENGING BEHAVIORS AT HOME Managing children's challenging or defiant behavior poses a

Managing children's challenging or defiant behavior poses a significant challenge for parents. Whether it's reluctance to put on shoes or tantrums, finding effective strategies can be puzzling. For parents seeking guidance, treatment strategies offer a roadmap for calmer, more consistent behavior management, nurturing children's developmental skills to handle their behaviors independently.

ABC's of Behavior Management at Home:

- Antecedents: Factors preceding a behavior that increase its likelihood, also known as triggers. Identifying and anticipating antecedents can help prevent misbehavior.
- Behaviors: Specific actions to encourage or discourage.
- Consequences: Outcomes following a behavior that influence its recurrence, positive or negative. Immediate consequences hold more influence.

Defining Behaviors:

Identifying specific, observable, and measurable target behaviors is crucial for an effective behavior management plan. Clear expectations help all parties understand what is required.

Antecedents – The Good and the Bad:

Antecedents can either fuel misbehavior or aid in managing it effectively before it escalates, reinforcing positive behavior.

Antecedents to Avoid:

- Making assumptions Clearly communicate expectations to avoid misunderstandings.
- Giving instructions from a distance: Ensure important directions are given face-to-face for better retention.
- Abrupt transitions: Provide advance notice for smoother transitions.
- Bombarding with questions or instructions: Presenting a series of tasks limits comprehension and compliance.

Antecedents to Embrace:

- Environmental awareness: Consider and manage factors like hunger, fatigue, or distractions affecting behavior.
- Adjusting the environment: Create a conducive environment for tasks by minimizing distractions and providing structure.
- Clarifying expectations: Establish clear expectations verbally to prevent misunderstandings.
- Countdowns for transitions: Prepare children for upcoming changes to ease transitions.
- Offering choices: Encouraging children to make decisions enhances their autonomy and sense of control.

BEHAVIORS (CONT.)

Effective Consequences:

- · Avoid negative attention: Negative attention can reinforce misbehavior, impacting self-esteem.
- Immediate consequences: Prompt consequences help children connect their behavior to outcomes.
- Consistent consequences: Maintain consistency in consequences to reinforce the relationship between behavior and results.
- · Positive Reinforcement: Acknowledging positive behaviors: Providing positive feedback for good behavior encourages continued positive actions.
- Active ignoring: Intentionally withdrawing attention for minor misbehavior can reinforce positive behavior.
- · Reward systems: Offering rewards for desired behaviors motivates children and maintains engagement.
- Time-outs: Implementing breaks effectively requires clarity, consistency, and adherence to rules.

By implementing behavior management techniques at home, parents can create a more peaceful environment for everyone.


