In Attendance: Colby Kolm, Gary Volk, Todd Roberts, Randy Howser, Pastor Fouts, Steven Whitney, Skye Schott, Kelsey Schnoor, Jennifer Lyon, Heather Whitney, Katie Schnitzler, Nick Onnen, & Bryan Wysocki

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Colby Kolm at 8:05 pm. Colby opened with a devotion and prayer.

Randy Howser made a motion to approve the November 21, 2022 council meeting minutes. Second by Skye Schott. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report by Katie Schnitzler. All budgeted income from childcare, school, and home ministry contributions are up from where we were at this time last year. The Day of Giving exceeded our goal of \$50,000 by raising a total of \$54,017.37. Thank you to all that donated! The final payment for the roofing project (between \$2,000-\$3,000) will be paid once they finish doing paint touch ups. This leaves about \$20,000 to help pay down the remaining building debt. The current building debt owed is \$163,675.04 and the operating line of credit currently has a balance of \$70,000. Gary Volk made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. Bryan Wysocki seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Trustees Report</u> by Todd Roberts. Bader Construction is done working on the roof. They will be coming back to paint a few spots on the ceiling in the sanctuary before the project is complete. Trustees have been discussing possible upcoming projects to utilize the 2023 Beryl Finkral distribution. These projects include things like landscaping, replacing heating units, or just applying the funds to the school building debt. They are always looking for more help with scooping snow. Contact Todd Roberts or Katie if you're willing.

<u>Elders Report</u>: by Randy Howser. Transfers Out: Casey Christiansen to Christ Lutheran Church, Mustang, Oklahoma. Affirmations of Faith: Connie Anderson & Andrea Hinkel. Randy made a motion to accept Casey Christiansen's transfer. Skye Schott seconded. Motion carried.

Evangelism Report by Heather Whitney. Evangelism reviewed budget sheets and costs of mugs and directories. Mugs are in and have started being distributed to people. They have extra for sale for those that didn't pre-order. Orphan grain train will be the collection for next month. They will get information out about what items could be donated for that. They also started brainstorming ideas for new board members.

Parish Ed Report by Jennifer Lyon. Sunday school numbers so far this year have been good. The "Parent & Me" class has about 5 regular families. Sonshine Station (age 3-6) has a regular attendance of 20 kids. Kingdom Express (Grade 1-4) has regular attendance of 12-15 kids. High school Bible study has 3 regulars. Evangelism and Parish Ed served about 65 people for their Advent meal last week (December 14). Parish Ed will start VBS planning in January.

Parochial Ed Report by Bryan Wysocki. Gym floor update: The old floor is out and the new wood is in. The crew will be coming in to sand and apply 2 coats of polyurethane. That will need to cure before they can paint. The gym floor is on schedule to be ready to use by January 16. Parochial Ed board members had nothing but good reports as a result of their classroom observations. The board has started looking at setting tuition rates for next school year (23-24) and reviewing accreditation section 3.

Early Learning Center (ELC) Report by Skye Schott. The center has four new hires, most of which are full-time. The butter braid fundraiser profited just over \$2,000 to go towards playground updates. There was a great turn out for Jesus' birthday party with lots of activities for children. The board is currently reviewing the staff handbook for finalization in January. They have also started working on next fiscal year's budget and requests for the 2023 endowment distribution.

<u>Stewardship Report</u> by Gary Volk. Stewardship board is now accepting high school senior scholarship applications. Information will go out in the newsletter and bulletins. The board discussed finding ways to update or improve the St. John Lutheran Church signs along highways 121 & 275. They will be serving meals following services the last weekend of consecration (January 28/29). Thank you to all that donated on Giving Tuesday.

Super-Delicious Zuppa Toscana Soup

Ingredients:

- 1 pound bulk mild Italian sausage
- 1 ¼ teaspoons crushed red pepper flakes
- 4 slices bacon, cut into 1/2 inch pieces
- 1 large onion, diced
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic
- 5 (13.75 ounce) cans chicken broth
- 6 medium potatoes, thinly sliced
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1/4 bunch fresh spinach, tough stems removed



Cook Italian sausage and red pepper flakes in a Dutch oven over medium-high heat until crumbly, browned, and no longer pink, 10 to 15 minutes. Drain and set aside.
Cook bacon in the same Dutch oven over medium heat until crisp, about 10 minutes. Drain, leaving a few tablespoons of drippings with the bacon in the bottom of the Dutch oven. Stir in onions and garlic; cook until onions are soft and translucent, about 5 minutes.
Stir in chicken broth and bring to a boil over high heat. Add potatoes and simmer until fork tender, about 20 minutes. Reduce heat to medium; stir in cream, cooked sausage, and spinach. Cook and stir until spinach has wilted and sausage is warmed through; serve.
Serve in a bread bowl or with toasted French bread.
