Advent by the Light of Grace

Though Epiphany is the season of light after the Christmas season, Advent is often characterized by the Advent wreath and the candlelight journey to celebrate the coming of the Messiah to bring grace to the world. Through Jesus we receive Amazing Grace. Just as we remembered during Lent this year, we also remember this Advent that 250 years ago John Newton wrote his famous hymn, "Amazing Grace."

This Advent we celebrate that Jesus is the Light of the World who shines on us with His amazing grace. Through Scripture, song and reflections, we will be reminded that Jesus makes His grace known through the undeserved gifts of hope, peace, joy and love—gifts revealed in special ways in the lives of Zechariah, Isaiah, Elizabeth and Mary. Then on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day we will see this light shining on the Shepherds and all of us through the message of the Angels.

Wednesday, November 29: Zechariah's story shines a light of hope. In his old age, after years of waiting and not giving up hope, Zechariah is blessed with a son, John the Baptist, who prepared the way for the Light of Grace, Jesus.

Wednesday, December 6: Isaiah's message shines a light of peace. Isaiah announces to an unsettled people that relief is coming soon through the Prince of Peace, the Son of God, the Light of Grace.

Wednesday, December 13: Elizabeth's story brings a light of joy.

The boy in Elizabeth's womb leaps for joy and so does she when Mary arrives, carrying the little Lord Jesus inside her. The Light of Grace is soon to come.

Wednesday, December 20: Mary's song reveals a light of love.

The mother of the Light of Grace sings a love song to the Lord for His undeserved favor toward her and toward all the world.

Sunday, December 24: The Shepherds' story shines light the Light of Grace on our darkness. On Christmas Eve we celebrate with Scripture, song and candlelight that the true Light of Grace has come. Jesus Christ graces us with His life as a little baby boy. We go with the shepherds to greet God's amazing grace in a manger and glorify Him.

Monday, December 25: The Angels' proclamation shines the Light of Grace for us and for all of the creation. On this Christmas Day we celebrate with Scripture and song that the true Light of Grace gifts us with His holy presence in the Christ Child. St. John Lutheran Church, Battle Creek, NE Council Meeting Minutes Monday, November 20, 2023

In attendance: Mike Anderson, Deanna Anderson, Bryon Anderson, Christy Schmidt, Katie Schnitzler, Karen Grant, Mark Baumgartel, Tia Eriksen, Nick Onnen, Reid Ehrisman, Brett Freudenberg

Call to Order/Opening Devotion and Prayer: Reid opens at 8:04pm with devotion and prayer.

Approval of Minutes: The September 18, 2023 minutes were reviewed. Mike Anderson motioned to approve the September minutes. Deanna Anderson seconded. Motion carried.

Board Reports

- a. Treasurer's Report by Katie Schnitzler. In the last month, operating debt has increased by \$50,000. Budgeted income continues to increase (up over 10% above previous year) but not at the same rate as operating costs (up over 19% from previous year). Major factors contributing to this are IRS mileage rate increases, insurance premiums, keeping pay rates above the minimum wage hikes, and general inflation. In comparison to last year at this time, operating debt is significantly less than it was at this time in 2022. Mike Anderson motioned to approve the treasurer's report, seconded by Brett Freudenburg. Motion carried.
- b. Trustees' Report by Bryon Anderson: Heating units have been replaced. Snow removal crew has been finalized. Attention is needed on a down spout at church. Lights have been added to the south side of the church and the trustees are going to add more to the east side in the future.
- c. Elders' Reports by Mike Anderson: At the last elders meeting they had visitor input to discuss concerns about confirmation. Reid encouraged all board members that are approached with concerns by an individual to direct those individuals to the appropriate board meetings or staff. Transfer In: Jacob Nathan from Christ Lutheran in Norfolk. Transfers Out: Elizabeth, Greg, Lucy, Theo, Gus, and Hazel Prauner to Grace Lutheran in Norfolk. Karen Grant motioned to approve transfers in and out. Christy Schmidt seconded. Motion carried.
- d. Evangelism Report by Tia Eriksen: Prayer walk signs are in place and they have been receiving positive feedback. The Operation Christmas Child event took place and was very successful. Evangelism hosted the potluck for church worker appreciation last month with good attendance. Evangelism is planning to help Parish Ed with an Advent meal. December's collection for Evangelism will go to Bright Horizons.
- e. Parish Ed Report by Christy Schmidt: There were 74 boxes packed for Operation Christmas Child. This is up from last year. VBS 2024 dates have been set for July 21-25. The free-will offerings collected from the Advent meal to go to offset the cost of VBS shirts. Parish Ed is planning to host a family potluck after the family Christmas service on Sunday, December 17.
- f. Parochial Ed Report by Brett Freudenberg: School hosted Grandparents Day today with a large turnout. Basketball practices have started. The basketball parents had the opportunity to sign a waiver to allow for practices to be held at St. John but no games will be played in our gym. The basketball teams are in need of new uniforms and plan to use the athletic fund to purchase some. Board members will be doing classroom visits soon. Mr. Onnen gave a gym floor update, stating that the construction investigator was on site two weeks ago to assess the gym floor issues. Currently, we are still waiting for the final report.
- g. Early Learning Center (ELC) Report by Deanna Anderson: The ELC will be losing some staff members soon, but Kelsey has rehired a previous staff member. The ELC needs part-time staff. Board members plan to reach out to other local schools to see if they can get some interest and will try to make the opportunity of working at the ELC known to as many schools, colleges, and job boards as possible. The ELC continues to prep for Step Up to Quality review. This will be the first evaluation through the Step Up to Quality process. The Butterbraid fundraiser is happening right now through December 6. Funds raised will go towards updating the toddler/infant playground equipment and play area. The ELC will be hosting a "Birthday Party for Jesus" on December 14 from 6:00 7:30 pm.
- h. Stewardship Report by Karen Grant: Stewardship board is planning to serve the LIGHT group a meal and discuss credit cards, budgets, and tithing on January 10. Giving Tuesday is November 28 and funds raised will be used for church parking lot lights, ELC playground updates, and school scholarships. Please help spread the word about St. John Ministries' Day of Giving!

a. Reid Ehrisman reminded the Council that no nominations were received for vice chairman when voting was done back in June. Reid has contacted several people to see if they would be willing to serve in that role with no success. Colby Kolm has agreed to be vice chairman if a nomination was not obtained. Mike Anderson motioned to appoint Colby Kolm as vice chairman. Seconded by Deanna Anderson. Motion carried.

From the Principal

When cars were first introduced to the public, there were no seatbelts, airbags, or driver's education classes. There was no doubt the technology would change the world, but it came with growing pains. Initially the world did not know how to harness the technology.



When the smartphone first became common, there was no doubt it would change the world, but we have not yet begun to harness the technology. Unfortunately, the negative effects are not identified as easily as a car wreck, and the solutions not as simple as a seatbelt.

From an educator's desk, I can alert you to the trends we're encountering. For instance, for the last several years the primary topic of conferences has focused on childhood mental health. This past October, Rev. Dr. Justin Hannemann shared that, in the last 15 years, suicide rates in people under the age of 22 have skyrocketed and are yet to plateau. In the same age group, among his clinics of study, the number one reason for referrals for mental health care was "process addiction" attributed to technology. While alcoholism allows the addict to be removed from the substance, process addiction is a compulsive behavior that comes from within.

Devices vibrate and chime like a slot machine enticing engagement. Our children, unbeknownst to them, are competing with brain researchers who are employed by social media and app creators charged with making their experience as customized and addicting as possible. Couple that with the fact that adolescent brains are developing and establishing lifelong behavior patterns. What chance do they have?

There is good news. We, the parents, during our children's most formative years, have the keys to the car. My parents didn't teach me how to use this technology responsibly because it wasn't around when I was growing up. We, however, have an opportunity! As parents, we are to teach and MODEL how to use devices as a tool rather than allow the devices control us. We can tether our devices to chargers, not because they need charging, but because we are practicing self-control. We can demonstrate our children's importance by looking them in the eye and having conversations. We can give them the social connection that they so desire and validate their importance by prioritizing them over a digital world. When the photoshopped social media world constantly tells them they aren't good enough we can validate their significance and the way that God made them. We can enforce parameters, unplug the internet, and require their devices to be turned off and in our care. We can practice what we preach because our best preaching is the kind done without words.

I pray that as you read this you would feel empowered and that you would make a specific plan. In Proverbs 22, God charges us to "train up a child in the way he should go." Yes, our primarily goal is to point them to Christ, but in doing so, we are to also care for their whole being.
