

Easter Eggs in Lent

Have you ever heard about the "Hidden Mickeys" at Disney World? Hidden throughout the Disney World property there are images, silhouettes, and other representations of Mickey Mouse and his iconic ears. Folks have fun hunting for these hidden pictures all over the parks.

During the season of Lent we take "Alleluia" out of our worship language and the somber services seem to be devoid of the praises to we are accus-

tomed to singing. Have you ever hunted for hidden messages of the resurrection in Lenten worship? Much like finding an unexpected mouse-head in the coils of a hose on the ground, an unexpected hint or reminder of the Easter joy lingers throughout this season of preparation.



Lenten hymns bring some of the obvious hidden gems. Ash Wednesday's "Savior, When in Dust to Thee" concludes in stanza 4: "By Thy deep expiring groan, by the sad sepulchral stone, By the vault whose dark abode held in vain the rising God, O, from earth to heaven restored, mighty reascended Lord, bending from Thy throne on high, hear our penitential cry!"

The forboding hymn "Go to Dark Gethsemane" takes us from the garden of betrayal to the judgement hall and Calvary's hilltop before "Early hasten to the tomb where they laid His breathless clay; all is solitude and gloom. Who has taken Him away? Christ is ris'n! He meets our eyes. Savior teach us so to rise."

We are often careful not to jump over Lent to get to Easter. I have even said, "We need Good Friday before we need Easter." You may remember hearing last month, "sweet isn't sweet until you've tasted bitter; and light isn't light until you've seen the dark." One might even say (or may have said) that the joy of the resurrection isn't joyful without the agony of Good Friday.

At our pastors conference just a few weeks ago the speaker said something that changed my approach to this topic. It was early on a Monday after a long drive to Kearney, and it may have been recently doubled in impact by the news of my grandmother's passing, but our presenter said the opposite of what I had said not too long ago. He said, "Easter gives Good Friday meaning." Without Good Friday, God still lives. His promise to redeem and save are there, but they are always in the future, beyond our vision. Good Friday brings a day of atonement, sin is paid for and death rears its ugly head. But death is always present in our human lives. Ever since the fall, death has seemed to be victorious. We lost count, but I believe the record before Jesus was somewhere in the millions to 2 when it comes to death. But Easter changes that.

Easter gives meaning and value to Good Friday. God is faithful, even to His Son, even to the one who BECAME SIN (2 Corinthians 5:21). Everyone dies, but Jesus opens the graves. Looking for this not-so-hidden prize, the empty tomb, and a victorious Savior brings great joy.

May you have the joy of finding all of these Easter Eggs hidden in the Lenten season and all the more as we celebrate the resurrection together Easter morning.

What is Worship? (April 2022)

Worship is Comforting & Disturbing

What happens in worship? As you have been reading these monthly explorations into the topic of worship we have seen that worship is about God and us. Mostly about God serving us followed by our opportunity to respond. This month we explore some of our feelings in and after worship.

On one side, worship is Comforting: after all in worship God serves us with the pure Gospel, whether that is through a baptismal remembrance, holy absolution, the hearing of the Word or the breaking of the bread, God is serving up forgiveness, hope, salvation, redemption and deliverance. Worship is comforting. It is comforting to hear that I am beloved and saved.

On the other hand, worship ought also be disturbing. In Isaiah 6, the prophet gets a glimpse of the Lord in the throne room with seraphim flying around, smoke and thunder filling the room, and Isaiah says, "Woe is me." In worship we are coming face to face with our holy God, and in His presence, our sinfulness is rightly disturbed. As the adage goes, "A sinner sweatin' in church."

If I come to worship and find no comfort, no good news, then we need to examine why the Gospel is omitted from the service, and sometimes we need the touch of personal absolution so Satan can cause no doubt in our comfort.

If I come to worship and am not disturbed, I need to reexamine if my life is as holy and perfect as I thought it was, or if the preacher is "pulling punches" to keep us from being confronted with the law.

In worship this month, ask yourself these questions:

What components or themes in the worship service today comforted me? What components or themes in the worship service today disturbed me?



That is the mission statement of St. John Ministries. The mission itself can be challenging, but it would be even more difficult to achieve without staff, volunteers, donations, and beautiful facilities. That is why it is essential for you to support the operational needs of St. John.

Stewardship starts with acknowledging God's role in providing for us. We praise, honor, and worship God, the giver of every good and perfect gift. Financial stewardship is taking what God has given you and giving it back to Him through your financial contributions to the church.

St. John Ministries is thankful for every gift received. This past year, however, has been financially challenging. St. John currently owes the bank \$115,500 in operating debt. If the operational needs of the ministry are not met, it further hinders the work we do for God.

This chart provides giving information for calendar year 2021 and only considers the gifts given to the general fund. If you gave \$500 to the building project and \$500 to the general operating budget for calendar year 2021, then you would be on the \$5 to \$9.99 per week step. Contact Katie (675-3155 or <u>business@stjohnbc.net</u>) if you would like to personally know where you are on the chart. No gift to the Lord is too small. That's true whether through monetary giving or volunteering your time. If every giving household gave \$5 more per week, there would be over \$60,000 added to the annual budget. We are asking you to prayerfully consider how you might contribute to the needs of St. John.

Monday, March 21, 2022

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Jeff Borchers at 8:06 pm. Jeff opened with a devotion and prayer.

Tim Wragge made a motion to approve the January 17, 2022 council meeting minutes. Second by Rod Nicolay. Motion carried.

<u>**Treasurer's Report</u>** by Katie Schnitzler. General fund giving continues to increase, but not at the same rate as ministry operating costs. Katie thanked the ministry-wide staff, boards, and volunteers that do everything they can to minimize expenses. The childcare was awarded a \$10,000 grant from Nebraska DHHS. The IGNITE auction was a huge success, raising just over \$122,000 for the remaining debt owed for the school building project. Katie made a \$110,000 principal payment leaving the balance of the construction note at \$325,834.33. The current General Fund balance is \$6,277.63 with one more pay period to fulfill before the end of March. Operating debt remains at \$115,500. Dave Praeuner made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report. Second by Rod Zohner. Motion carried.</u>

<u>Trustees Report</u> by Matt Unkel. The trustees reviewed bids for fertilizing services campus wide. Zach Westerman will be considered for mowing services for the ministry again. An adjuster came to inspect the roof a couple weeks ago. The insurance company will contact Katie once the adjuster's report is submitted.

<u>Elders Report</u> by Dave Praeuner. The elders discussed the Easter worship schedule. There will be no Saturday night service. Easter Sunday will have a 6:30 am service, breakfast at 7:30 am, and a 9:00 am service. Elders reviewed their budget items for the 2022-2023 fiscal year and looked at gathering names to serve on the elders board. Transfers OUT include: Jim Wennekamp to Our Savior, Norfolk, NE, Tom Ziehmer to Our Savior Norfolk, NE, and Rick & LeAnn Cherington to St John Yankton, SD. Dave Praeuner made a motion to approve the transfers out. Second by Randy Howser. Motion carried.

Evangelism Report by Heather Whitney. Evangelism reviewed the costs of mugs and finalized what they would like to order for members to purchase. They discussed the upcoming Lenten meal they will be serving and different activities in the community they would like to do. The coffee, snacks, and fellowship after church is still not getting many more people to stick around. Evangelism is asking other church leadership and board members to stick around if they can and see if that helps get others to stay also.

<u>Parish Ed Report</u> by Tresa Prauner. Parish Ed discussed the upcoming Lenten meal they will be serving with Evangelism. Proceeds from the meal will go towards t-shirts for VBS. They did more planning for VBS in July. VBS kickoff registration will be May 1st after Sunday School. They will soon be making calls to get the volunteers needed for VBS.

Parochial Ed by Tim Wragge. IGNITE was a successful event. The plant sale is underway through May 2nd. Proceeds from the plant sale will go toward the building debt and playground updates. The St. John Hawks finished their season 20-3, returning from Nationals in Indiana making it to championship Sunday. Thank you to everyone who had a hand in making the trip happen. The girls, coaches, and parents represented St. John well.

Childcare Report by Brad Prauner. Childcare is still having issues retaining staff. The board is looking at sitting in on staff meetings to get feedback from employees. The childcare board is also considering making some positions "called". Laura Johns has submitted her resignation from the childcare board. Brad will contact someone they had in mind to see if they would be willing to finish out her term. The board reviewed their budget and discussed names for nominations.

Stewardship Report by Rod Zohner. Stewardship reviewed the monthly checks written. The board finalized details for the Lenten meal they will serve on April 6th. There was one application received for the St. John High School Senior Scholarship. Stewardship reviewed and awarded \$500 to Richard Brauer. Once again there will be a scholarship money available for those students attending LHNE next school year. The LHNE scholarship application deadline is May 15th. All boards should have their final budgets returned to Katie by April 15th.

Old Business:

Nominations Committee – A meeting will be scheduled in the next couple of weeks.

All boards need to turn in any new names for nominations to Jeff Borchers.

When disaster struck Ukraine and the United States announced its plan to withhold trade and imports from Russia because of its choices, I couldn't help but think of the people who I met and worked with when I went on mission trips in Russia and the Baltic States about ten years ago. I remember stepping into a country that was obviously hurting and missing something (or rather, someone,) that had taken so much hurt and confusion from my own life, and that was Jesus. Since the time of the Soviet Union, religious practices have been minimized in Russia, and the effects of living in a nation where God is not remembered or recognized are visible almost from the moment one steps foot into that great land. Even after only being overseas for two weeks, I remember coming home and feeling a sense of peace again, especially increased the first time I was able to go back to my home church to worship. It's easy to forget what is truly needed when we see people hurting each other with words

and actions, when wars take over, or when we ourselves are facing battles of our own that measure all over the scales. But those moments when we come back to God, seek His peace, presence, and forgiveness, and are reminded of His love for us are so sweet and needed in moments of hurt and pain. I pray that, as you read this, you are able to turn any of your current struggles (big or small) over to a God who loves you so deeply that He gave His beloved Son so that one day, you can experience eternal joy, peace, and rest with Him.

St. John church pays for approximately 80% of the cost to educate a child at St. John School. This leaves a little over 20% of the costs for the families. We never want finances to be an obstacle between families and a Christ-centered education and have the following resources to help:

FACTS Management Plan

St. John offers an optional automatic payment plan. FACTS Management is a company that will automatically withdraw the specified amount from your bank account monthly to make payments to St. John. FACTS Management charges an annual fee of \$45.00.

Children's Scholarship Fund of Omaha

St. John families have been awarded \$13,900 in Scholarships from the Children's Scholarship Fund (CSF) of Omaha in the last year. CSF is funded from a source outside of St. John. Scholarships are based on the cost to educate, not the cost of tuition, making it possible for your scholarship to bring in more for the school than your tuition fees would!

St. John Fund Scholarship

St. John Scholarship Fund was established to help families with the additional need for assistance who may not qualify for the CSF. Apply by going to <u>www.stjohnbc.net/scholarship</u> The St. John Scholarship Fund awarded \$13,800 dollars toward tuition assistance to 25 students for the 2021-2022 school year. Praise God for His provision!

Lawson Walz Scholarship Fund

St. John School has been the beneficiary of ongoing memorial funds given in memory of Lawson Walz. These funds work in conjunction with the St. John Scholarship Fund to assist those who demonstrate additional financial need.


